Our Contributions

- Provided over \$200 million in direct grants, support, and cost savings to colleges
- Contributed more than \$3 million to the California Community College system office
- Grown grant, contract, and fee for service revenues to \$30 million
- Spearheaded a historic statewide fundraising effort, in partnership with the Bernard Osher Foundation, establishing the California Community Colleges Scholarship Endowment; distributed 15,000 student scholarships to date
- Raised almost \$5 million to support the California Community Colleges Student Success Initiative
- Employed over 3,000 students with public and private employers through the Career Pathway Program
- Trained over 1,000 smog check technicians through the Bureau of Automotive Repair student training program
- Placed nearly 140,000 students in California and over 430,000 students nationwide in clinical training sites through the Centralized Clinical Placement System matching technology platform
- Served over 20,000 current and former foster youth and other high-risk student populations through programs, services, and sub grants to colleges

The System We Serve

- The California Community College system is the largest higher education system in the nation, comprising 112 colleges and 72 districts and serving 2.1 million students.
- Community Colleges offer associate degrees and job training certificates in over 175 fields, and over 100,000 individuals are trained each year in industry-specific workforce skills.
- Two-thirds of first-time higher education students in California begin at a Community College.
- Community College transfer students account for 48 percent of all University of California bachelor degrees in science, technology, engineering, and math.
- Community Colleges graduate 70% of California's registered nurses and 80% of firefighters, law enforcement officers, and emergency medical technicians.
- Students who earn a degree or certificate from a California Community College nearly double their earnings within three years.
