### Our Contributions

- Since its founding in 1998, the Foundation has provided over \$200 million in direct grants, support, and cost savings to colleges.
- The Foundation has contributed more than \$2.8 million to the California Community College system.
- Since inception, the Foundation has grown its grant, contract, and fee for service revenues to over \$40 million.
- From 2007–11, led by a \$25 million lead gift and matching challenge from The Bernard Osher Foundation, the Foundation spearheaded a historic statewide fundraising effort, establishing the \$68 million California Community Colleges Scholarship Endowment.
- The Foundation's total investment funds are worth approximately \$78 million.

### Our Programs

- Youth Empowerment Strategies for Success programs served approximately 2,800 current and former foster youth in California in 2010–11.
- The California Connects digital literacy training program serves 5,800 Mathematics, Engineering, Science Achievement (MESA) students on 33 Community College campuses.
- The Nursing Resource Center's Centralized Clinical Placement System has increased enrollment capacity in San Francisco Bay Area nursing programs by 20 percent.
- The Career Pathway program has employed more than 2,500 students from over 150 California institutions as student assistants at state agencies and organizations.
- More than 250 smog check technicians have been trained through the Foundation's Technician Training – Bureau of Automotive Repair program. Trainees have helped over 75,000 consumers since 2004.
- Facilities Utilization, Space Inventory Options Net (FUSION) data has been instrumental in passing \$22 billion in state and local capital construction bonds.
- In 2007, Community Colleges saved over \$7.3 million on furniture, equipment, and supplies purchases through the Foundation's CollegeBuys purchasing program.

### The System We Serve

- The California Community College system is the largest higher education system in the nation, comprising 112 colleges and 72 districts and serving 2.4 million students.
- California resident tuition is among the lowest in the country. On average, tuition makes up only 5 percent of a student's expenses.
- Community College students received over \$1.8 billion in fee waivers, scholarships, and grants in the 2009–10 school year.
- More than 45 percent of Community College students are 25 or older and considered nontraditional students.
- Two-thirds of first-time higher education students in California begin at a Community College.
- Community College transfer students account for 48 percent of all University of California bachelor degrees in science, technology, engineering, and math.
- 85,000 associate's degrees and 41,000 career certificates were awarded during the 2009–10 school year. More than 92,000 students transferred to a four-year institution.
- Approximately 55 percent of California State University graduates and 30 percent of University of California graduates transferred from a Community College.
- Community Colleges graduate 70 percent of California's new registered nurses and 80 percent of California's firefighters, law enforcement officers, and emergency medical technicians.
- Over half of all California veterans receiving GI Bill educational benefits attend a California Community College.

The Foundation's mission is to benefit, support, and enhance the missions of the California Community College system, the largest higher education system in the nation.
